EMERGE USA carries out its mission through three unique lines of programming: Emerging Voters, Emerging Data and Emerging Leaders.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CO-CHAIRMAN

This year saw the rise of the minority voice in American politics and you the members of EMERGE USA played a crucial role. I want to thank you for your support and tell you briefly how we used your contributions. We entered 2012 with aggressive goals for our three main focus areas: Emerging Voters, Emerging Data, and Emerging Leaders. Together we surpassed our goals and have set the Muslim, Arab, South Asian (MASA) American communities on a path that will pave the way for the next generation to represent all Americans.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CO-CHAIRMAN

Emerging Leaders was fully revamped to follow the model of some of the top leadership development programs in the country. We took steps to ensure the resources were in place to make the Emerging Leaders program among the elite leadership development programs for college age young people across the state. program will create quality leaders who will understand all sides of a problem and the needs of all constituents. The retooled program helped us achieve "Best Non Profit" of the year from the Magazine Florida. New Times South in

Through our Emerging Data program our database of registered MASA voters grew from 120,000 to above 150,000. This continued investment into a core asset of the community will allow for us to continuously gather information through our constant polling of this database in order to produce data for social and political science research, media, and elected officials about the MASA community. Our data and organizational model were key components to academic publications such as "Engaging American Muslims: Political Trends and Attitudes" by Professor Farid Senzai of Santa Clara University.

Emerging Voters "get out the vote" efforts this year resulted in a voter turnout of just over 80 percent from our database of registered MASA voters. This was accomplished through investing vast resources into a three prong attack to get people to vote. We used our ongoing phone banking activities to tirelessly call our database to encourage them to vote. We also created a strong public push for absentee balloting and early voting by visiting religious and community centers, as well as universities to talk about the importance of increasing the value of the MASA community within the political process. Finally,

EMERGE USA used dozens of volunteers on Election Day to help make sure people could find their polling stations. All of these efforts resulted in an unprecedented level of energy and enthusiasm in our communities this election cycle and made it a cultural norm to vote. This is a sea of change in community culture which will allow us to put more resources into directing MASA members into the party structure and allowing them to participate more fully in civic life.

This year EMERGE USA was very visible in the news and was able to show that our communities are an asset to our neighborhoods, cities and country. Our data was the source of a New York Times piece called the "Muslim Swing Vote" in early spring of 2012. Since then we have continued to be a visible flag bearer for the community so our children will be active participants in this process for years to come. 2013 will be another exciting year where we will continue to work hard for you and ensure that your voice is heard within policy discussions that influence the future of our country.

EARLY VOTING DAY

EMERGE USA formed a coalition of organizations to turn out the early vote for 2012. In October 2012, Florida Muslim early vote day was able to turn out over 1,000 votes from the Muslim, Arab, and South Asian communities in Florida.






Did you vote in the 2012 Presidential Elections




Which party do you feel reached out to you for your vote?



Who did you vote for?




How did you vote?


